


A Ride through Oldsmar History

Ransom Eli Olds, a pioneer of the American automotive industry, sold his car company – Oldsmobile – to General Motors in 1905.

In 1916, he purchased land to develop a planned community at the northern tip of Tampa Bay, today known as the City of Oldsmar.

The Oldsmar Historic Bicycle Tour is a guided causal bicycle ride along the Oldsmar Trail. Riding one "loop" or all three, enjoy this scenic trail as your tour guide reveals lore of Oldsmar's past, including stories of a casino, a famous author's brother, a haunted hotel, a totem pole and more!



The "Loops"

NORTH

PARKS: Richard Rogers, Cypress Forest

DISTANCE: 7-8 Miles

SOUTH

PARKS: Veterans Memorial, Bicentennial, Mobbly Bayou Wilderness Preserve, Mobbly Bayou Beach

DISTANCE: 6-7 Miles

WEST

PARKS: Harbor Palms Nature Trail, Sheffield, Canal Sports Complex

DISTANCE: 7-9 Miles

All guided Oldsmar Historic Bicycle Tours start and end at R.E. Olds Park, 107 Shore Dr W, Oldsmar, FL. Helmet use is required by law for participants under 16 years of age and encouraged by those over 16 years old.
